

Dear Friends:

The United Methodist Home for Children (UMHC), located in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania, is pleased to announce our plans to merge with the Board of Child Care (BCC), an organization that shares our tradition of serving children and families through the social justice ministry of the United Methodist Church. UMHC will become United Methodist Home for Children, a Program of the Board of Child Care.

UMHC was founded in 1917 by the Central Pennsylvania Conference of the Methodist Church (now the Susquehanna Conference of the United Methodist Church) as an orphanage. Each day, our Mechanicsburg campus serves approximately 35 children between the ages of 12-20 using a collaborative trauma-informed approach to care. This merger will enable UMHC to leverage BCC's scale and deep expertise, thereby, continuing our 100-year legacy of providing exceptional care to young people and their families in Pennsylvania.

Similar to UMHC, BCC began as three orphanages operated by the United Methodist Church in Maryland and the District of Columbia during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Today, it is a highly-respected provider of early learning, mental health, and therapeutic residential services to more than 700 children and families across the mid-Atlantic.

BCC has invested in attaining national accreditations by both the Commission on Accreditation for Residential Facilities (CARF) and the United Methodist Association's Educational Assessment Guidelines Leading toward Excellence (EAGLE) Commission. Accreditations help ensure programs and operations meet and exceed industry best practices. In several cases, BCC has been nominated or won best practice awards from both groups.

The Bishops of each of the governing conferences, along with the boards of directors of BCC and UMHC, and our leadership teams, enthusiastically support this partnership. BCC is an excellent partner for UMHC due to its United Methodist history, traditions, core values, and methodology for delivering services.

Our next steps will be to work with the Pennsylvania State Attorney General and Cumberland County Orphan's Court to approve the transaction. It is anticipated that the merger will be completed in the fall of 2018.

We anticipate a smooth transition and will work collaboratively to ensure minimal disruption to our employees, children and operations. Select executive leadership positions at UMHC will be retired and new leadership positions will be announced in the coming weeks. For example, a new Director of Pennsylvania Programs will be added to align with BCC's regional leadership structure. As the current President and CEO of UHMC, I will be ending my tenure in the near future.

In addition, two Central Pennsylvania residents currently serving on the board of UMHC will become board members of BCC. The Bishop of the Susquehanna Conference of the United Methodist Church also has the option to appoint a representative to the BCC Board to attend on behalf of the Conference.

As part of the merger, Laurie Anne Spagnola, President and CEO of BCC, will provide executive leadership to UMHC. Jackie Columbia, MS, LCSW, LCPC, a member of BCC's executive leadership team, will provide direct guidance and oversight to the Director of Pennsylvania Programs.





FROM THE EDITOR, JERRY CLINE

Psalm 102:16 NIV For the LORD will rebuild Zion and appear in His glory.

Many "resets" have been necessary in the community of believers from the time God called Abraham to establish those peculiar to the one true Lord. Sojourner Truth is in such a reset period. Not as earth-shaking as the period of rebuilding of the walls of Jerusalem after the Babylonian exile. And not quite as stressful as the rebuilding of the temple. But a reset just the same.

Nehemiah was given the privilege of rebuilding the walls. God used Cyrus (the Medo-Persian King prophesied by Isaiah 100 years earlier) and a host of Jews returning from exile to accomplish the work. And the tremendous statement is made, "the people had a mind to work". (Neh. 4:6) Work they did. With a sword in one hand and building equipment in the other, they finished the task in record time.

Neh. 6:16 "When all our enemies heard about this, all the surrounding nations were afraid and lost their self-confidence, because they realized that this work had been done with the help of our God."

The rebuilding isn't without it's sin, however. After the walls were rebuilt, and time was given to rebuild homes, the temple was to be started. But a strange thing happened. Materials were gathered, but the people said, "The time has not yet come to rebuild the LORD's house." (Haggai 1:2)

Meanwhile the paneling was disappearing from the temple area and reappearing in people's houses! 3 Then the LORD sent this message through the prophet Haggai: 4 "Why are you living in luxurious houses while my house lies in ruins? 5 This is what the LORD of Heaven's Armies says; Look at what's happening to you! 6 You have planted much but harvest little. You eat but are not satisfied. You drink but are still thirsty. You put on clothes but cannot keep warm. Your wages disappear as though you were putting them in pockets filled with holes! 7 "This is what the LORD of Heaven's Armies says: Look at what's happening to you! 8 Now go up into the hills, bring down timber, and rebuild my house. Then I will take pleasure in it and be honored, says the LORD. 9 You hoped for rich harvests, but they were poor. And when you brought your harvest home, I blew it away. Why? Because my house lies in ruins, says the LORD of Heaven's Armies, while all of you are busy building your own fine houses. 10lt's because of you that the heavens withhold the dew and the earth produces no crops. 11 I have called for a drought on your fields and hills—a drought to wither the grain and grapes and olive trees and all your other crops, a drought to starve you and your livestock and to ruin everything you have worked so hard to get." 12 Then Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, and Jeshua son of Jehozadak, the high priest, and the whole remnant of God's people began to obey the message from the LORD their God. When they heard the words of the prophet Haggai, whom the LORD their God had sent, the people feared the LORD . 13 Then Haggai, the LORD 's messenger, gave the people this message from the LORD: "I am with you, says the LORD!" 14 So the LORD sparked the enthusiasm of Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and the enthusiasm of Jeshua son of Jehozadak, the high priest, and the enthusiasm of the whole remnant of God's people. They began to work on the house of their God, the LORD of Heaven's Armies, 15 on September 21 of the second year of King Darius's reign. (Hag. 1 NLT)

Has Sojourner Truth Ministries been called and established by God? Is He calling us to "rebuild" His vision of this ministry? The Board thinks so and is in the process of doing just than in searching for a director and programs of ministry.




