The Voice Of God


When we hear the voice of God Speaking to our hearts, Do we obey and follow Him Or are we slow to start?



Son Light House, established in 1982, is a non-profit, ecumenical, and community-supported resource that distributes food, clothing, and limited furniture to individuals and families in need and that qualify on family income guidelines set up by state and federal policies. Son Light House serves individuals and families in eastern Lycoming County. Son Light House is an equal opportunity provider.

Suppose a brother or sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to him, "Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about his physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead. (James 2:15-17). According to the U.S. Census Bureau, those who lack daily food are "Food Insecure." In Lycoming County during 2013, 14% of residents were food insecure. The child food insecurity rate was 21%. If we have faith, then we must take action – both charity (providing food) and justice (changing systems to eliminate food insecurity) are necessary. Otherwise "what good is it?" Thanks to those who do take action!
