

YOUTH COORDINATOR OF ELIMSPORT VALLEY PAR-ISH, MARCH 17, 2016

The Director of Youth/Children ministries of the Elimsport Valley Parish is an extension of the pastor in providing leadership within the parish.

Qualifications:

The Director of Youth ministries must possess exceptional communication and interpersonal skills, be able to work with the pastor and other staff or volunteers within the parish. This person should have the gifts and graces to minister to children and youth. They must maintain a high regard for the mission of the church and Christian discipleship.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Coordinate the youth ministry (grades 6 - 12) of the Parish.

Plan, organize and lead a youth program.

Organize field trips and service projects with the youth.

Be available to youth in a nurturing and supportive role.

Plan, organize, and lead an annual Youth Sunday worship service.

Publicize the programs.

United Methodist Home for Children

Dear Friends,

Just like your family, we want the kids living at the Children's Home to have a delightful Christmas experience and carry those memories with them for the rest of their lives.



Most of our kids have been abandoned, neglected or abused (physically, emotionally and in other ways). Many struggle with a lack of trust and limited relationship skills. Holidays can be particularly hard for them, especially if they cannot go home or when they have only limited or supervised access to family members.

Understanding and nurturing kids who have experienced real trauma takes not only a dedicated staff, but also access to an extensive range of programs and services to meet their needs. Our kids often require extra time and very intentional therapeutic interventions as they seek to understand their pain and overcome their fears. Many of these treatments are not covered by reimbursements and we must find ways to make them available.

As important as it is to meet their physical needs, it is also crucial to provide them with comfort, safety, dignity, and a sense of belonging within a family, which they experience in abundance at the Home. Care workers help the kids find words to express their feelings, and, while the professional staff calls this developing emotional intelligence, the kids call it heart-to-heart conversations, which are so vital to their healing.

Despite their challenges, our kids wish for the same things that children everywhere do: a new pair of jeans, a warm coat and boots, sports equipment, and the ability to enjoy the festivities with carefree hearts. For some, it may be the first time they experience the personal attention and Christ-inspired kindness that most of us take for granted at the holidays.

This year, as you count your many blessings, please remember that some Central Pennsylvania young people cannot go home for the holidays. Your generous gift now will become life-long Christmas memories for youth who need your support. Giving to and caring for our kids is at the heart of our ministry every day, but the staff and volunteers at the United Methodist Home for Children are especially inspired by the holiday spirit, and we know that you are too.
