#### **Making the Grand Gesture**

Just before Valentine's Day, I joined another man standing at the rack of cards. We flipped cards open, commenting caustically about the soppy verses inside.

Suddenly he found one. "It's right, you know," he said, looking at the words. "We men are not good at the little things. We think the occasional grand gesture is enough to prove our love."

And then, as I was signing it for Joan, a penny dropped.

All through my childhood, I read books about men making these grand gestures. Horatio and his buddies stood at the bridge, fending off the enemies of ancient Rome. Sidney Carton took his friend's place at the guillotine during the French Revolution, saying, "It is a far, far better thing I do than I have ever done."

And, of course, there's Jesus.

For a grand gesture, it's hard to beat the crucifixion. Jesus himself emphasized the supreme sacrifice: "Greater love has no one than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends."

I wonder if the emphasis given to this one act derives from the predominantly male leadership of the Christian church for the last 20 centuries. Because the grand gesture is a very masculine way of showing

love. It's no coincidence, I'm sure, that the message of the crucifixion - and all the guilt that goes along with it - continues to be most strongly promoted in churches that cling to male leadership.

I asked a female minister how often she had preached about the crucifixion as the atonement for our sins.

"Never!" she exploded.

I've heard quite a few sermons by women over the years. None of them ever glorified the crucifixion either. If anything, they chose to focus on the little things in Jesus' life. A touch in a crowd. A hand that helped a little girl rise. A kind word for a widow. An act of compassion for a troubled father.

To these women, the grand gesture was meaningless - unless it was backed up by the smaller acts that give it credibility.


