A new year always seems for me to be a call to look once again at the direction of my life, especially my spiritual life. Something I look at is my prayer life. I ask myself, how am I growing and what are my prayers revealing about my relationship with God. Something which I have found to be a real blessing are prayers that others have written as part of their own spiritual journey. A book of prayers that I have found to be very insightful is, Prayers from the Heart, by Richard J. Foster. Here are a few prayers that I invite you to sit with, allowing the words resonate in your soul.

Spirit of the Living God, be the Gardner of my soul. For so long I have been waiting, silent and still experiencing a winter of the soul. But now in the strong name of Jesus Christ, I dare to ask: Clear away the dead growth of the past, Break up the hard clods of custom and routine, Stir in the rich compost of vision and challenge, Bury deep in my soul the implanted Word, Cultivate and water and tend my heart, Until new life buds and opens and flowers.

O Lord, my God. Form me more fully into your likeness. Use the circumstances and interactions of this day to form your will in me. From the frustrations of this day form peace. From the joys of this day form strength. From the struggles of this day form courage. From the beauties of this day form love. In the name of Jesus Christ who is all peace and strength and courage and I love. Amen.

Somehow, Jesus, I like praying with a cup of coffee in my hands. I guess the warmth of the cup settles me and speaks of the warmth of your love.

I hold the cup against my cheek and listen, hushed and still.

I blow on the coffee and drink. O Spirit of God, blow across my little life and let me drink in your great Life. Amen.

Each of these prayers speak to me of my great need for the God's nurturing presence to accompany me throughout my day, and often to nudge me to seek his kingdom and not my own. I am often astounded by the distractions of life and how prayers such as these awaken my soul to the depth of my humanness and to the richness of God's love and of his commitment to me.

I invite you to take one of these prayers or find another, or even write one of your own and then pray it every day for a week or month. Meditate on it. Use it to measure what is going on in you and how you are sensing the movement of God in your life. Use it to let God open your eyes to things he wants to reveal to you. If you have a breakthrough of some sort, share it with someone. It may be just what they need.


