

#### 4 Reasons for Christians to Celebrate Independence Day

July 4th marks the birthday of the United States. Many commemorate the occasion with fireworks, cookouts, or displaying an American flag. But are there any biblical reasons Christians can find to celebrate Independence Day? Scripture offers at least four clear reasons.

#### 1. Gratitude for Religious Freedom

First, America offers significant religious freedom for Christians (and others) to freely worship. The United States continues to operate as one of the nations offering the most religious freedom worldwide.

Did you know that more than one-fourth of the nations in the world (53) include some form of legal restrictions or prohibition toward Christian activities? In many places across the globe, you can lose your job, be arrested, or even find yourself sentenced to death for following Christ. Yet in our nation, we can attend the church of our choice, openly read the Bible on our own or with others, and openly pray to God.

Despite ongoing legal challenges to certain Christian activities in America, the nation still enjoys great religious freedom. This is certainly something to celebrate.

#### 2. Appreciation for Those Who Defend Our Freedom

Second, Christians can thank God for those who serve and have given their lives to defend our freedom. This includes past military veterans, current military personnel, as well as honoring their family members.

We often forget our freedom of religion and other freedoms can only continue if our armed forces protect our nation and national interests. While this does not mean we have to agree with every military decision or conflict, we can be thankful for all those who serve and their families.

#### 3. Thanksgiving for the Opportunity to Participate in Government

Third, we can thank God for the opportunity to participate in the democratic process of our nation. While politics is often viewed negatively, governing leaders are ordained by God (Romans 13) and are to receive honor from those who follow Christ.

Further, our nation offers the ability to participate through voting, advocating for issues important to our values, and even options to run for political office. Contrast this situation with the tyrannical Emperor Nero who led the Roman Empire during the New Testament period and you'll quickly appreciate the opportunity to have a voice within the political process.

#### 4. Thankfulness for Peace with Family, Neighbors, and Friends

**Fourth, we can express appreciation for a nation at peace.** If you lived in Syria today, your home and community would live under the threat of civil war. In many parts of Sudan, you would live in fear of your town being attack by rebels. If you were a Christian living in Iraq, you may be forced to flee for your safety.

Despite significant violence within the United States, the nation remains free of war within its own borders. Most of us take this peace for granted, yet millions worldwide long for a single night of rest without fear of attack in their communities. We can at least take a moment to thank God for the peace He has provided for our family, our community, and nation. As <u>Jeremiah 29:7</u> teaches, we can seek the good of the city where we live and work to impact those around us with the love of Christ.

Memories cast shadows, the past echoes, the present beckons.

In my 20's I walked the barrios of San Antonio and listened to hungry babies crying in the night as they rolled in their sweat from the insufferable heat, and I saw that those who suffer most from poverty are innocent of it.

In my 30's I walked the halls where the mentally ill were warehoused as hopeless, and I saw that those who suffer most from lack of care and concern are innocent of it.

In my 40's I walked amid the hovels of untouchables in India who are forced to live in squalor apart from all others because of their birth, and witnessed the poor lay dying in the streets of Calcutta or their bodies floating dead in the Ganges, and I laid hands on fevered infants and leprous adults, and I saw that those who most suffer from cast and class are innocent of it.

In my 50's I walked in a squalid underground cardboard refuge in Malaysia, and saw that those who most suffer from religious persecution are innocent of it.

In my 60's I walked the dusty trails of an indigenous tribe in Mexico forced to live in the high Sierra Madre's where the soil is volcanic and a small stream is the only water source and the infant mortality rate was 60% by age 2, and I saw that those who are most affected by ethnicity are innocent of it.

In my 70's I have walked among the poor, the ostracized, the disfranchised, the sick and the dying in Williamsport and have seen that those most affected by injustice are innocent of it.

As I stand on the threshold of my 80<sup>th</sup> year, these images still haunt me, still echo in my mind, still beckon me to serve the Shepherd as He has called...to find the green pastures, to lead beside quiet waters, to guide in paths of righteousness, to prepare a table in the presence of the enemy, to anoint the sick with the oil of gladness.

Thank you for your past support, for with it we make a very real difference in the lives of those whose medically related issues are addressed constantly at SOS. Any health or medical issue is a reminder of the mortality that every human must face, and every day it is our joy to address their fears and their faith. Thank you for your supporting this healing ministry.

Son Light House serves individuals and families in eastern Lycoming County. Son Light House is an equal opportunity provider.

And who is my neighbor? (Luke 10:29) Jesus tells the person who asks what must one do to inherit eternal life that one is to love God and neighbor. A second question "And who is my neighbor?" results in the parable of the Good Samaritan. At Son Light House many "neighbors," fitting many descriptions, from newborns to elderly, come from every community in eastern Lycoming County. They may be suddenly unemployed or living in long-term poverty. We are called to be Good Samaritans — treating immediate needs and also to be the innkeeper in the parable who takes on a commitment without a known end.

#### FEATURING "FROM OUR HANDS TO YOURS" CLOTHES CLOSET

This ministry of STM is overseen by **PASTOR CHRISTINE CARROLL**, who faithfully distributes needed items during the hours of 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. M,T,W,F. As an example of what this ministry accomplishes---- during the month of April: 66 people received 716 articles of clothing, bedding- 9, electric appliances – 3, personal care items – 205.

The closet also shares excess with other ministries. This month 37 cases of crock shoes (1,404!) were sent to Friends Can Make It Happen, Inc. in Freeland, PA. Last month 25 cases of adult pull-ups were donated to Leighton Place in Williamsport. Unused items go to American Rescue Workers.

The Clothes Closet needs volunteers to switch from winter to summer clothing.


