Graduation or commencement? It's funny how we use two words with different meanings to describe the same event. During May and June each year, many people attend graduation or commencement ceremonies, at which students are given diplomas or certificates of recognition. But are those students graduating or commencing? The answer is they are doing both. The word graduate comes from the Latin word gradus, which means a step, and is a step of completing a course of study at a school or college. The word commence means to begin or start, as one would begin or start in a new direction or begin or start a new project. As students complete their courses of study, they are taking a step to begin a new direction in life, so they are not only graduating, they are also commencing.

This is how it is when one accepts Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior; we call this being saved. Paul explains it this way in his letter to the Romans in chapter 10:9-10 that "if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that

God raised Him from the dead, you shall be saved; [10] for with the heart man believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation." We also call this being "in Christ." Paul also explains the change in a person who is in Christ, and that change is like the change that graduates experience in their lives. In 2 Cor. 5:17 he says "Therefore if any man is in Christ, he is a new creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come."

For the graduate <u>and</u> one who accepts Christ as Savior the old ways are over, they have graduated and the new things have come, they begin a new life with an exciting future. The graduate and the believer have both experienced graduation and commencement; an ending and a beginning. May God be with all of you, whether a scholarly graduate or a spiritual graduate as you commence your new life. Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. (Prov. 3:5)



Chicken-Fruit Salad

2- 13oz. Cans chicken, drained 1- 20oz. can pineapple tidbits 2 to 3 ribs celery, chopped ½ cup dried cranberries, more or less ½ to ½ cup Ranch dressing

8 oz. of small shell pasta, cooked

Mix altogether, chill and serve.

Red Beet Cake

2 ounces unsweetened chocolate, melted

1 ½ cups puréed beets

1 ½ cups sugar

I cup oil

3 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 ³/₄ cups flour

½ teaspoon salt

1 ½ teaspoon baking soda

Mix melted chocolate and beets in a bowl, set aside. Cream sugar, oil, eggs, and vanilla in a mixer bowl until light and fluffy. Add in beet mixture; mix well. Add to this mixture the flour, salt and baking soda; mixing well.

Spoon into greased, and floured 9X13 cake pan.

Bake at 350 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes or until cake tests done.

Yield 12 servings.

Clearances


