

Sometimes Dad's hands corrected me, disciplined me, shielded me, rescued me.


Dad's hands protected me.

The Future of the United Methodist Church as proposed by the Council of Bishops

At the 2016 General conference of the United Methodist Church, the task of moving forward in regards to human sexuality and the church's struggle with human sexuality, was given to the Council of Bishops of the United Methodist Church. As a result, a committee of 32 members, Called the Committee on a Way Forward, was formed. This committee was to represent over 12 million United Methodist members in recommending to the Council of Bishops a plan for the church to move forward on matters of human sexuality. The Council of Bishops, made up of the Bishops from every conference of the United Methodist church all over the world, would then decide on how the plan would be presented to United Methodists all over the world. The plan would then be voted on at a special General Conference to be held in February 2019.

As a result, the committee originally in November 2017 came up with three models to present to the Bishops.

Model 1 would keep things the way they are in regards to our Book of Discipline and our view in regards to homosexuality.

Model 2 would remove the current language in our Discipline, which rejects homosexual practices and ordination of homosexuals in the church. It would then be up to the local church to decide whether they would reject or accept these issues, and any church wishing not to accept the change, would not be forced to perform same gender weddings or have homosexual clergy in their church.

Model 3 would create different branches of the church, each with their own Book of Discipline and values though all the branches would still be connected as one church.

In each case, there was supposed to be a way provided for members and clergy to graciously exit the denomination, in the event they disagreed with the way the church chose to move forward.

As a result, only one model was accepted by the Council of Bishops this spring and is going to be presented in February 2019 as the way forward for the United Methodist Church. That model, which is Model 2, will propose removing the restrictive language in our current Book of Discipline and allow each local church to choose to accept or reject homosexuality as an acceptable practice, to allow or reject homosexual or lesbian clergy as their pastor, and to allow or reject same sex weddings.

United Methodists recognize all people as God's creation having sacred worth, so this creates a spiritual struggle within the church as to how to include and accept certain groups of all ages, nations, races, and genders.

As of yet, no plan has yet been presented for those who wish to leave the denomination, to do so graciously. This will be a long process that could take a few years to resolve.

There are groups that have formed and are working on developing a place that is more in line with our current doctrines, to provide a place to go for those leaving the denomination.

Please be in fervent prayer about our United Methodist Church and that God will strengthen us through these difficult times.
