Edible Jelly Bean Bracelets (A great craft to do with kids)

Supplies:

Elastic cording

Bag of jelly beans

Embroidery needle (or needle with a large "eye")

Instructions:

- 1. Cut a piece of elastic to around 6" in length.
- 2. Tie a knot (or two) at one end of the piece of elastic approximately 1" For easier tying off, do not get the knot to close to the end.
- 3. Thread the elastic through the needle.
- 4. Thread the center of the jelly bean onto the needle, pulling it down to the end of the piece of elastic.
- 5. Continue threading jelly beans until desired length is reached.
- 6. Triple knot the bracelet and trim off excess elastic.

- S Increased adoptions by 10 %
- O Decreased euthanasia by 36 %. (53% for cats)
- Timproved the quality of life for animals through 505 new investigations and 379 check backs
- Successfully prosecuted 26 cases of cruelty
- Cared for 3,173 animals, of which, 346 were seized through investigations
- Rehomed 1,237 animals
- Spayed or neutered every healthy animal prior to adoption

What did it take to make Thanksgiving possible? – Son Light House used 8,794 cans and boxes of food for the Thanksgiving distribution. This figure does not include cereal, bread, and turkeys that were also distributed. Thanks for your continuing support!

Monthly Average of Recipients Increased in 2014

The average number of households coming each month to Son Light House in 2014 was 600 representing 1,443 average monthly recipients. These figures represented a 1.3 percent increase over the previous year. This was the second largest monthly average since 2008 when the economic conditions took a dramatic downturn nationally.

New Households in 2014

A total of 127 new households came to Son Light House last year for assistance.

Easter Distribution on April 1 and 2

The distribution for Easter will occur on the Wednesday and Thursday prior to Easter. Hams will be distributed at that time. The Senior Box distribution that normally occurs at the beginning of the month will be rescheduled to April 15-16.
