

State Grant Money is depleted! – Son Light House relies heavily each year on State Grant Money which is used to make purchases of food at substantially reduced rates from the Central PA Food Bank. For the first time that annual allotment has been totally depleted and only half way through the fiscal year. Donations of cereal, non-perishable food, and money will thus be all the more important this year! Hams will be distributed at Easter as usual.

Monthly Average of Recipients in 2017

The average number of households coming each month to Son Light House in 2017 was 494 representing 1,168 average monthly recipients. Son Light House continues to be one of the largest food pantries in Lycoming County.

New Households in 2017

A total of 121 new households came to Son Light House last year for assistance. This figure matched the new

recipients for 2016. Individuals and families in need persist in our communities.


