

Be Flexible

Be flexible, was not a truer statement than the week of April 9th thru April 16th 2016. Twenty-eight Williamsport District Volunteers in Mission applying in January, paying \$250.00, traveling for 12 hours, arrived in Sumter, South Carolina expecting to help repair a few of the 2,000 homes damaged in a recent storm.

April 7th we were notified the disaster relief office was just handed our applications from the main office. You will be replacing four roofs. "WHAT??? Please, look at the roster, average ages 60-74, sixteen are women, look at our abilities; 1 certified electrician; 3 retired contractors; experienced plumbers; experienced in dry wall, experienced painters; AND we stated, we would do NO roofs." From past experience, Sumter Disaster Relief committee does not take stock in applications. They claim the abilities written were glorified as to the actual capabilities.

Sunday: for those who were able to travel Saturday, headed early for Myrtle Beach, which was 125 miles away. We watched our kids (34) meet the ocean and Praise God for it and the sand, had morning devotions, and walked the boardwalk, returning to Sumter to visit with the 7 varieties of swans at Swan Lake.

Monday: we were divided in to Crews 1 and 2 to do roofs, Crew 3 replacing a small piece of flooring, Crew 4 dry walling and etc. Crews 1 & 2 worked quite late to secure covering for where old roof was removed. Crew 3 discovered a large part of the floor needed replaced. On top of that, the sewage was emptying into the crawl space under the trailer. Two of our men volunteered to put on hazmat suits and dip the raw sewage out.

Thursday: a third man volunteered to crawl under and GLUE the pipes together. Tuesday: we woke up to pouring rain. Crews were divided into projects 3 & 4, a crew drove miles to look at sites requiring only a day's work; and 1 person cleaned at our host church.

Tuesday afternoon: four of our crew went to help a lady remove books from her home into storage. The owner and her husband bought an old plantation house in 1975. She woke up one morning after the storm, very ill. It was discovered surface water had flowed under the house and had taken out a pillar. The illness came from the mold that had started underneath and had gone to the third floor.

Monday thru Wednesday: I was on Crew 1 doing roof and seeking out sites. Although I did go on the roof, I was 95% of the time on the ground with the cleanup crew and visiting with the owner and her son, Robert. Robert was in a car acci-

dent at the age of 15. Now fifteen years later, he is still in a wheel chair. Because of his disabilities, he has not been able to hold onto any jobs for any period of time. His mother works at Wal-Mart.

NO WORK SITES:

Wednesday: 2 of our team found a men's shelter near our host U.M. church and volunteered to clean their kitchen. After that they purchased the food for Thursday night's "Thank You" for allowing us into your home to serve you.

Thursday: 4 (including me) did more shopping, cooking, and setting up of tables and chairs.

Friday: my birthday, 3 of us removed our leftovers from the kitchen and took them to the men's shelter where we divided it into smaller portions. (It was food distribution day,) then we handed out T-shirts from the U.M. Albright Care Center in PA. After lunch, we just hung out until the rest of the crews returned and showered.

It was, in ways, like we were on vacation. Every morning instead of the usual cereals and toast, etc., we were guests at Shoney's breakfast buffet. Two evening meals were provided by the Presbyterian Church. Friday we expected to return to the Presbyterian Church only to have J. D., who met us every morning at Shoney's, come at 5:30 to give us directions to a cabin belonging to the Shoney's owner. After watching the alligators swim, we were treated to a delicious meal of brisket, coleslaw, baked beans, rolls, ice cream and cake.

The second floor of the cabin, which is rented out for weddings, was all open space looking out over first floor. It had sitting room furniture and a screen for brides to dress. Cabins were taxed by the number of bedrooms in them.

The best part of the trip was the fellowship of 28 people becoming brothers and sisters, like family, in Christ. And the love and gratefulness shown to us by the homeowners, we got to work for.

For those who questioned me about going, my only problem was the odor of all the new air mattress provided for us. I was immediately given a cot and my own sleeping quarters. And I stood in the rain while the other 5 went into the plantation house with the owner to see if any of our crew could help remove items.


