

Qualifications:

The Director of Youth ministries must possess exceptional communication and interpersonal skills, be able to work with the

pastor and other staff or volunteers within the parish. This person should have the gifts and graces to minister to children and youth. They must maintain a high regard for the mission of the church and Christian discipleship.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Coordinate the youth ministry (grades 6 - 12) of the Parish.

Plan, organize and lead a youth program.

Organize field trips and service projects with the youth.

Be available to youth in a nurturing and supportive role.

Plan, organize, and lead an annual Youth Sunday worship service.

Publicize the programs.

Appropriate Act clearances would need to be obtained.

Christmas at UMHC begins and ends with Christian love.

The world has changed, and sometimes young people are unable to live with their parents through their growing up years. Many of the kids who come to the United Methodist Home for Children (UMHC) have been abandoned, abused or assaulted. Most were removed from unsafe environments by county youth services and the court system. Some tried foster care and, for many reasons, were unable to thrive. UMHC is there when there is no family to take them in or care for their special needs, such as depression, traumas, or post-traumatic stress and other disorders.

For nearly 100 years, UMHC has been there when kids (ages 12 to 20) need a home. Our overarching mission is to serve youth and their families from Central and Southeastern PA. We offer:

- · youth-centered programs,
- · family support services,
- · faith-based perspectives, and
- · community connections.

Many kids arrive at the Home lacking hope. They long to celebrate birthdays, holidays, proms and graduations. Some need medical care, therapeutic treatments, and educational coaching. Many have never known the simple joys of being in healthy relationships.

WHAT DO THE KIDS NEED MOST?

People expect to hear things like shampoo, teddy bears, and basketballs. However, the answer is **your outright gift or a gift card.**

Many kids come to us with unique and specific needs beyond the basics (food and clothing). Abuse,



abandonment and neglect create situations that call for personalized care. Kids who want to be adopted need very different things than those, at ages 18-20, who are exiting the system.

Why do we ask for cash or a gift card? Things are changing. Your cash gift allows us to get what the kids need (without sales tax) and it will generate a tax-deductible receipt for you. Gift cards make great rewards for positive behavior and teach life lessons about spending money.

Childcare services have evolved, and UMHC has adapted its delivery model to meet those needs with a collaborative, traumainformed approach to care. Youth living at the Home receive safe housing, emotional and educational support, food, clothing, medical and behavioral healthcare, counseling, and more in a family-like atmosphere that inspires them to hope, heal, recover, and grow.
