

YOUTH COORDINATOR OF ELIMSPORT VALLEY PARISH, MARCH 17, 2016

The Director of Youth/Children ministries of the Elimsport Valley Parish is an extension of the pastor in providing leadership within the parish.

Qualifications:

The Director of Youth ministries must possess exceptional communication and interpersonal skills, be able to work with the pastor and other staff or volunteers within the parish. This person should have the gifts and graces to minister to children and youth. They must maintain a high regard for the mission of the church and Christian discipleship.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Coordinate the youth ministry (grades 6 - 12) of the Parish.

Plan, organize and lead a youth program.

Organize field trips and service projects with the youth.

Be available to youth in a nurturing and supportive role.

Plan, organize, and lead an annual Youth Sunday worship service.

Publicize the programs.

Appropriate Act clearances would need to be obtained.

Thanks also for putting me up at the Best Western in Lewisburg on the 3rd. My accommodations were very pleasant, and the staff very friendly.



United Methodist Home for Children



UMHC was founded in 1917 by the Central Pennsylvania Conference of the Methodist Church as an orphanage. Childcare ser-

vices have evolved, and UMHC has adapted its delivery model to meet the needs of kids ages 12-20 using a collaborative, trauma-informed approach to care. Youth living at the Home receive safe housing, emotional and educational support, food, clothing medical and behavioral healthcare, counseling and more in a family-like atmosphere that inspires them to hope, heal, recover and grow.

Kids come to us with unique and specific needs. Abuse, abandonment and neglect create situations that call for personalized care. Kids who want to be adopted need very different things than those who are exiting the system at age 18 and up. Gift cards help us make great rewards for positive behavior and teach life lessons about spending money. The cards we use most are \$25, \$50 & \$100 Visa gift cards. \$20 Cards for Sheetz, Target, Kohl's, Dick's Sporting Goods & Wal-Mart. \$10 cards for Applebee's, Pizza Hut, Papa John's & Subway. \$5 cards for McDonald's, Burger King, Wendy's & Dollar General Stores.
