Dear Sojourner Truth Ministries friends and supporters,

Greetings. God's blessings are especially evident during the summer and we sincerely hope this letter finds you enjoying the season. Things at Sojourner Truth Ministries (STM) are certainly busy during the summer months. Those we serve appreciate the cooler comfort of the basement seating where they take a needed breakfast or lunch, and our summer food programs targeting the many school children on break have been quite full. In fact, there never seems to be a "down time" at STM. We are so blessed to be able to serve so many in need. You, of course, are receiving this letter because of your support of STM and missions like ours. Without your assistance, much of our work could not be done. We recognize that you already answer so many appeals, but since you are *our* partners and supporters, we believe you should be aware of our current achievements AND the new financial struggles that threaten their continuation.

STM continues its faith-based services to Williamsport's disadvantaged community. The daily meals we serve feed our clients' hunger for faith, food, community, and self-esteem. When we provide bread and fruit, after-school snacks, a clothes closet, free public health fairs, a friendly gathering place, Sunday church services, and so much welcoming love and respect to all, STM actually nourishes the physical and spiritual needs of our local community who rely on this assistance, unable for various reasons to completely provide for themselves.

Some of these programs are the fruit of assessments made several years ago when STM, with the help of a grant from the United Methodist Church Conference, identified specific areas of hardship where STM could further help. We were able to expand our outreach with social service assistance and referrals to hopefully prevent further impoverishment of fellow citizens. Just two years ago, the Lycoming County United Way recognized STM for how we address the human service needs of our area, and we began a relationship toward partnering with this important organization. STM felt able to plan on meeting the escalating use of our programs. This led the STM board to recognize some specific areas as so imperative to sustaining our mission that two part-time, minimum wage positions were added-filled by two incredibly dedicated individuals who volunteer much more of their own time and effort to other outreach ministries, as well. We give God thanks for the many volunteers (including clients themselves, charches, organizations, and individuals) who allow us to operate with minimal employee expense. Our thanks and praise also for all items given, discounted and grant food from the Central PA Food Bank and area grocery stores, building-type grants from the First Community Foundation, and the generosity of individuals who give consistently as part of our fundraising events, during Raise The Region, annually, and more. We rely on all of these.

Our problem is that while the *need* for our missions continues to grow, our financial resources have been severely reduced. The United Methodist Church Conference grant ended in the first quarter, 2017. Due to unmet fundraising goals within the United Way's Fall 2016 drive, their funding of STM was also reduced, beginning July 2017. We now face a large income hole that will result in the loss of programs and possible staff reductions, necessitating further cuts in services. We are conserving as much as we can (without reducing services), but we are rapidly using up our small financial reserves.

We firmly believe that God provides. We will continue to apply for new grants and funding. Please let us know if you are aware of any further resources for organizations like STM. Competition for such aid is high, and success is uncertain. As previously said, most of you are already donors and we know that there are many worthy charities in need of help. Nonetheless, we ask that you please consider Sojourner Truth Ministries in this current and ongoing appeal.


The Kingdom Kids puppets will be presenting a program in the Fel-

GOD'S SOVEREIGNTY !!!! Introduction

In Psalm 103, a magnificent hymn of praise, David praises God for His blessings and compassion as a loving and forgiving father for his children (vss. 1-18). He concludes with a universal call for praise (vss. 19-22), but he begins this call with a declaration of God's sovereignty (vs. 19) for it is God's sovereignty that gives Him the absolute freedom to do what He does in His blessings and showing compassion to frail and temporal humanity (vss. 15-16). Psalm 103:15-19 As for man, his days are like grass; As a flower of the field, so he flourishes. 16 When the wind has passed over it, it is no more; And its place acknowledges it no longer. 17 But the loving kindness of the LORD is from everlasting to everlasting on those who fear Him, And His righteousness to children's children, 18 To those who keep His covenant, And who remember His precepts to do them. 19 The LORD has established His throne in the heavens; And His sovereignty rules over

all. (emphasis mine)

Have you ever thought about how the physical heavens literally rule over the earth? They can ruin us or bless us. Warm us or cool us. Burn us or freeze us. Make our crops productive or destroy them. We have learned that climate and atmospheric conditions affect not only our health, but psychological behavior.

And what are the heavens? They are the creation of God, but they also illustrate God's sovereign majesty over our lives.

Scriptures such as Psalm 103:19 often relate God to the heavens not because He is so far removed from us as to space, but because in His sovereign majesty He is so high above us in power, nature, and sovereignty.

One of our problems today is that we have lost the biblical perspective of the majestic greatness of God, and we have a completely wrong focus on God. As J. B. Phillips points out in his book, *Your God Is Too Small*, people today see God as:

(a) the resident policeman; (b) the grand old man; (c) a parental hangover, or some other short-sighted, twisted view of God.

The sovereignty of God may be defined as the exercise of His supremacy, His infinite rule, His authority and power. Being infinitely elevated above the highest creature in authority, nature, and being, He is the Most High Lord of heaven and earth and all creation whether angels or the heavenly hosts.

Basically, God's sovereignty means that He is the Supreme Ruler who immanently and personally rules over all the affairs of the universe—and this includes our personal lives both as individuals and as a local body of believers. God's sovereignty is a place of rest for the child of God, as well as a cause of worship (cf. Psalms 48:1; 95:3, 6).

One particular place of rest and application in relation to God's sovereignty and rule is His guidance and work to accomplish His purposes for our lives individually and corporately. Paul has this in mind, at least in part, in Philippians 1:6 when he says: "I am confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus." (Compare also Ephesians 1:11-12.)

Such actions of God's sovereignty are seen in the life of
Naaman the leper as God worked to lead this man to
Himself. Of course, men may resist and fail to respond to
God's grace, but even then God rules and uses them for His
own purposes as He did with Pharaoh (cf. Proverbs 16:5).

GOD'S GRACE !!!

What is a definition of God's grace?

ANSWER:

To learn the definition of God's grace, it is wise to understand the Greek and Hebrew words behind this term.

A prominent Old Testament word describing God's grace is *chesed*. This word speaks of deliverance from enemies, affliction, or adversity. It also denotes enablement, daily guidance, forgiveness, and preservation.

The New Testament word is *Charis*. It focuses on the provision of salvation.

Definition of God's Grace – How do theologians define it?

"What is *grace*? In the New Testament grace means God's love in action towards men who merited the opposite of love. Grace means God moving heaven and earth to save sinners who could not lift a finger to save themselves. Grace means God sending His only Son to descend into hell on the cross so that we guilty ones might be reconciled to God and received into heaven. '(God) hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin, that we might be made the righteousness of God in him'" (2 Corinthians 5:21).

"Grace may be defined as the unmerited or undeserving favor of God to those who are under condemnation."

Definition of God's Grace – What does the Bible say?

"This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference between Jew and Gentile, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus" (Romans 3:22-24).

"In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace" (Ephesians 1:7).

"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast. For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:8-10).

"For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ" (John 1:17).

"For if, by the trespass of the one man, death reigned through that one man, how much more will those who receive God's abundant provision of grace and of the gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man, Jesus Christ!" (Romans 5:17).

"Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost; Which he shed on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Saviour; That being justified by his grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life." (Titus 3:5-7)

Getting Back To God

There are ups, downs, and unexpected turns. Though you may go back along a trail you have been traveling, the one thing you don't want in your Christian walk is to go backwards spiritually.

Backsliding refers to going backwards spiritually and morally. When a believer backslides, he falls back in some way into a less desirable condition. His lapse may be a relatively minor one and unintentional. He may simply fall back through neglect by not praying, reading the Bible, and keeping his focus on living for God.

On the other hand, a believer may backslide by deliberately choosing to indulge in this life's sinful pleasures. This type of backsliding can carry disastrous consequences. It can bring dishonor to the One who laid down His life for us, Jesus Christ. It can also sadden and bring grief to the lives of loved ones. Of course, backsliding can bring turmoil into the believer's own life. He may be plagued by guilt or even a feeling of despair or condemnation. But there is good news for the backslider! God does not condemn him. God's loving concern for the backslider is steadfast and sure. The Lord calls that person back to Himself through the work of the Holy Spirit. We can see this clearly in the parable of the prodigal son. In the parable, the father saw his son returning while he was still far off. But the father did not lock the doors or demand that his son leave. Instead, the father welcomed his return. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion for him, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. (Luke 15:20)

Then the son confessed to his father:

Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight; I am no longer worthy to be called your son. (v. 21)

The father's relief and joy at seeing his son was so great that he did not even reprove him or rebuke him. Instead, the father instructed his slaves: Quickly bring out the best robe and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand and sandals on his feet; and bring the fattened calf, kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found. (v. 22-24) The father showed that the son's return was not a time for condemnation, but for celebration. And they began to celebrate. (v. 24)

If you are backslidden.

Like the parable of the prodigal son, know that the Heavenly Father truly cares about you and wants you to return. He does not post an angelic guard to keep out your prayers and your heart's cry. When the Lord hears you calling out to Him, He will respond positively to you. Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. (James 4:8)

Do not let anything hold you back from God and His forgiveness and grace. Don't let the pleasures of sin deceive you. In time, sin will bring you pain. Also, do not let doubt or guilt hold you back, for He promises you:

If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:9) The Lord's mercies are new every morning, but do not assume that you are promised tomorrow. Pray to the Lord now.

After you have called upon the Lord and asked for His forgiveness, believe His promise to forgive you. He will surely cleanse you of your sins and restore you to fellowship with Him. Let His Spirit touch your heart and bring healing to your soul.

If you hurt people while you were backslidden, then ask them for forgiveness. Do what you can to repair any damage you may have caused in other people's lives. Seek healing and reconciliation of broken or injured relationships.

Learn from the mistakes you made that led to backsliding, and determine to not repeat those mistakes. Ask the Lord for wisdom in how to live faithfully as an overcomer. Above all else, guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life. (Proverbs 4:23, NIV) Beware of the enemy's schemes. Flee from situations that tempt you. Rebuke Satan when he attacks you. Have a trusted prayer partner that you can share your personal struggles with. Now flee from youthful lusts and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, with those who call on the Lord from a pure heart. (2 Timothy 2:22) Finally, let the Holy Spirit lead you, fill you, encourage you, and empower you as you go through the day. If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit. (Galatians 5:25)

Do You Want a Relationship with God?

If you want this kind of relationship with God, pray this prayer right now:

Lord Jesus Christ, I believe that you took the pain of the cross to give me new life. I ask you to come into my life and to give me your peace and joy. I confess that I am a sinner -- that I have gone my own way and have done wrong. Please forgive me for my sins. I receive you now as my Lord and Savior. Please fill me with your Holy Spirit. Help me to follow you and to serve you all my life. Thank you, Lord Jesus. Amen.

If you prayed that prayer, you are now a child of God. The things of your old life have passed away and He has made all things new.
