

"God's Special Care"



Do you believe in Gods Special Care for His children? In the book of Exodus, He miraculously provided food, water, clothing, and shelter on a daily basis for the Children of Israel. He parted the waters of the Red Sea allowing them to cross then closed the waters behind them thereby destroying their enemies.

In Josh 6:20, the nation of Israel received Gods Special Care when God broke down the 'walls of Jericho'; In Josh 10:12-14 when He caused the sun to set still for nearly a whole day as his people won the battle over their enemies.

Christians sometimes mistakenly assume they will receive God's special care only after reaching Heaven, but Jesus said that God would look after the needs and safety of His children here on earth.

Jesus said, "Do not worry then, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear for clothing?' 32 For the Gentiles eagerly seek all these things; for your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things." (Matt 6:31-32, NKJV).

In Matt 6:33, Amp, Jesus said. "But seek (aim at and strive after) first of all His Kingdom and His righteousness (His way of doing and being right), and all these things taken together will be given you besides."

The Future of the United Methodist Church as proposed by the Council of Bishops

At the 2016 General conference of the United Methodist Church, the task of moving forward in regards to human sexuality and the church's struggle with human sexuality, was given to the Council of Bishops of the United Methodist Church. As a result, a committee of 32 members, Called the Committee on a Way Forward, was formed. This committee was to represent over 12 million United Methodist members in recommending to the Council of Bishops a plan for the church to move forward on matters of human sexuality. The Council of Bishops, made up of the Bishops from every conference of the United Methodist church all over the world, would then decide on how the plan would be presented to United Methodists all over the world. The plan would then be voted on at a special General Conference to be held in February 2019.

As a result, the committee originally in November 2017 came up with three models to present to the Bishops.

Model 1(traditional plan) would keep things the way they are in regards to our Book of Discipline and our view in regards to homosexuality.

Model 2 (One Church Plan) We would all be under one discipline but this would remove the current language in our Discipline, which rejects homosexual practices and ordination of homosexuals in the church. , and any church or clergy wishing not to accept the change, would not be forced to perform same gender weddings or have homosexual clergy in their church.

Model 3 ((Connectional Conference plan) would create different branches of the church, each with their own Book of Discipline and values though all the branches would still be connected as one church. It would then be up to Annual Conferences and the local church to decide whether they would reject or accept these issues. Churches and clergy would be allowed to join with a conference which is in alignment with their beliefs and practices. We would still be the United Methodist Church, but the different geographical conferences would be allowed to adopt their own discipline regarding human sexuality.

In each case, there is supposed to be a way provided for members and clergy to graciously exit the denomination, in the event they disagree with the way the church chooses to move forward.

Although one model, which is Model 2, was accepted by the Council of Bishops this spring and is going to be recommended by them in February 2019 as the way forward for the United Methodist Church, all three plans are now going to be presented.

United Methodists recognize all people as God's creation having sacred worth, so this creates a spiritual struggle within the church as to how to include and accept certain groups of all ages, nations, races, and genders.

As of yet, no plan has yet been presented for those who wish to leave the denomination, to do so graciously.

There are groups that have formed and are working on developing a place that is more in line with our current doctrines, to provide a place to go for those leaving the denomination.

Please be in fervent prayer about our United Methodist Church and that God will strengthen us through these difficult times.


