

When King Solomon wrote Ecclesiastes, he recorded many things he had experienced and tested in life. His conclusion is in the opening verses of Ecclesiastes, people come and go, the sun rises and sets and rises

again, and nothing is new. As we watch our earth slowly but surely preparing for the winter months, we look back on the spring and summer, which started out hot then cool then hot

again; wet then dry, and now cools off as the sun begins its journey into the southern sky. For some, it's a depressing time, for others it's an exciting time. The leaves begin to drop, we shake the dust off our hoodies, and our gardens begin to wither. For some, anticipation builds as days in the woods hunting are not far off, our adult kids return to college, and many are preparing food for freezing or canning. It's all part of the cycle of life.



Several times in his writing, Solomon comes to the conclusion that there is a time for everything and that all we can do in life is just to take one day at a time and to eat and drink and find satisfaction in our work. But one thing he makes clear, in chapter 2, verse 25, that satisfaction comes from God and without God who can find enjoyment. He tells us in 3:11 that God has made everything

beautiful in its time. So as a result, Solomon puts things in proper perspective in Ecclesiastes

3:12-13. He says, "I know that there is nothing better for men than to be happy and do good while they live. That everyone may eat and drink and find satisfaction in all his toil, this is a gift of God."

Yes, every season is a gift of God for our benefit and satisfaction. As we look back on the spring and summer, one thing remains clear, without God in our lives each day, we will never be satisfied. There is

a time for everything and although God's timing may not match ours, we must remember that he makes everything beautiful in its time, and we will find satisfaction when we stop for a moment and reflect on how God has been with us, and will be with us, in every cycle of life we go through.

Transform Lycoming CountyAugust 10-14

I once again had the privilege of helping with First United Methodist Church's, Williamsport, Pa Mission Outreach.

This project was started three years ago to help senior citizens, disabled and low income families do minor repairs, painting, and yard work around their homes.

Starting out in 2013 there were about 5 churches and 98 people involved. In 2015 we grew to 3 hubs (First Church, Muncy and Jersey Shore), 46 churches, 95 job sites and over 400 people.

God works in many places and in many different ways. It was a joy to hear the testimonies from both the home owners and the volunteers. It was a God given privilege to work with people from HOPE filling boxes with food at the Food Bank , and to hear a good suggestion [twice], that worked, from a mentally challenged person. Many renewed friendships and new friends were made. I even meet a cousin I never knew.

Last year in my story, I asked for prayers for Zack, a little boy at a home I was involved with. I understand he is having more seizures and not eating. It is being considered giving him a feeding tube. Please think of him and his family in your prayers.
