
# Valley Views

I have found that my focus as a pastor, as a teacher and even as a spiritual leader has increasingly become more centered around living out our relationship with Christ in everyday life. So much so, that I see our relationship with Christ intricately woven into every aspect of our daily walk of faith. One of the amazing things is just how functional this relationship is when it lived out with others. It ceases to be just about the things I believe and how deeply I feel God's presence in my life that day, rather it is in the attitude and conviction to follow Christ that I take into each.

I feel that the main way we do this is by following the commandment that Jesus gave to us, "love one another as I have loved you." Anyone who seeks to follow Jesus Christ as the Way, the Truth and the Life, must wrestle with how they are living that out and remaining true to this new commandment Christ gave us. Sometimes people will ask, "Is that it? Isn't there more, isn't there a list of do's and don'ts?" We must be careful, because when we focus on something external and something removed from Christ himself, we will have moved away from him and gotten mired in a performance-based religion. We will risk losing our connection with Christ

that we so desperately need to live a life of faith and service to one another.

So how do we keep ourselves grounded in keeping our relationship with Christ as the main driving force in our lives and how do we live out a faith that is responsive to it? This past year or so, our former Bishop, Jeremiah Park, in caring for our spiritual well-being, asked us if we were staying in tune with Christ. To check if something is in tune, like a piano, it is checked against something that always vibrates with the proper tune, such as a tuning fork. For us to be in tune with Christ, everything about us would be in tune with Christ's command to us. Our challenge is to desire for this for ourselves and then to participate with the Holy Spirit to work this change in us. Here is a guideline to help you daily to stay in tune with Christ. Ask yourself these questions, daily if possible.

Have I loved others as Jesus loves me?

When did my words or actions reflect Christ's love and when did they not? Who did I share the grace of Jesus with today?

Have I spent time in prayer?

Have I spent time in scripture?

How have love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, faithfulness, generosity, gentleness, and self-control been witnessed by others in my life today?

Have I asked God for forgiveness?

Receiving that forgiveness, I will rest securely in God's presence and rise to face tomorrow with renewed dedication and hope, assured that I am God beloved child. Looking again at the command of Christ we see there is a flow of deep relationship that immerses us in the well-being of one another. The result is a love given to another that has its beginning in Christ and that also has coupled with it, the personal warmth and compassion of each one of us. The tune or tone of our lives then becomes that of Christ himself living his life through us. That's why we miss the real life-giving, redeeming, and transforming nature of our relationship with Christ, when we make it all about "me and Jesus." It's not, it's more, much more. It is us and Jesus together. It's then that we are in tune with being the body of Christ. This can be a real challenge for us, because it calls us to take our inward focus and turn it outward, to care more for others more than we do for self. Use this to analyze and evaluate the ministries in which you are involved. Where is the focus of your faith? Are there opportunities to bless others, to show concern, and empathy that are beyond your own circle of family and friends? Ask Jesus to make his love for you real, so that you can really love others as he has loved you.
