I am continually amazed at the different themes that are woven throughout scripture. For instance, the theme of food and feasting. It begins in Genesis with the creation of all kinds of plants and trees to provide fruit for food. God then provides food in the wilderness for the Israelites as they fled captivity in Egypt. Jesus himself told us to pray in the Lord's Prayer, "Give us this day our daily bread." Jesus shares with his disciples his deepest promise to us in the Last Supper and we continue that in our sharing of Holy Communion.

Sitting at a table with Christ reveals the depth of the personal nature of God. We see it again displayed in Revelation 3:20, where Jesus gives the church this promise: Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me.

This is a verse about fellowship and of intimacy with Jesus as we sit at a table and dine with him. Can you possibly imagine what that will be like? What will you talk about, what struggles will you share, what will you celebrate? The Bible then concludes with all who have trusted in Christ gathered together at the great Banquet Feast of the Lamb in Revelation 19. I invite you to sit and meditate on that for a bit. It is overwhelming.

I'm sure you can pull out other examples, there indeed are many, which is why these verses from our Lenten Devotional stuck with me. It is from Isaiah 55:1–3 and I have it printed here from the New Living Translation.

- 1 "Is anyone thirsty? Come and drink— even if you have no money!
 Come, take your choice of wine or milk— it's all free!
- 2 Why spend your money on food that does not give you strength? Why pay for food that does you no good?

Listen to me, and you will eat what is good. You will enjoy the finest food.

3 "Come to me with your ears wide open. Listen, and you will find life.

I will make an everlasting covenant with you.

I will give you all the unfailing love I promised to David.

What goes through your mind as you read this invitation? Notice there are no preconditions, no getting your life in order first, no theology tests, no quizzes on church doctrine, just the invitation to come eat, drink, and receive.

I am discovering that this is something that God keeps putting before me and it is on that I have needed to learn to sit with once again this Lent, which is why I am thankful for the devotional inviting me to spend time with this image.

Lent does invite us to sit still long enough to be mindful of the ways we are thirsty and hungry, not just physical, but also spiritual. So often people think that Lent is about inflicting suffering upon ourselves so that we can share more fully in Christ's sufferings. But if that is our main focus, how do we connect with the invitation to enter into the love of God revealed in Jesus? How do we really come before God with our lives wide open, inviting Jesus to come and to commune with us at that place in us where we are the most hungry and thirsty for His love?

The invitation here concludes with, "Come to me with your ears wide open. Listen, and you will find life." I find I am really drawn to the phrase, "and you will find life." Oh yes, I want that Jesus. I truly do. How about you? Do you want to find the life Jesus offers? He said that he came so that we may have life and have it in abundance (John 10:10). He is talking about experiencing this life now, which involves getting some of heaven into you daily experience of life.

Perhaps a good thing to seek as you sit with Jesus. This involves quieting our minds long enough, pushing aside all that would compete with the voice of God, and telling Jesus you love him and want to spend time with him.

Easter is just a few weeks away. I invite you to use this remaining time to come before Christ in a committed way. If you are not sure how to do that, ask the Holy Spirit to guide you, to help you to commune with Jesus who lives inside of you. You will often find him in the place where you are the most hungry and thirsty for his love and presence. This isn't complicated, just something different than most are used to, but not for the great people of faith throughout the ages, and also for a great many others of whom you and I are not aware.

May the remainder of your Lent be blessed and may you celebrate the Resurrection of Christ with a renewed passion.
