Lights and Christmas just go together, don't they? From the smallest candle to the biggest Christmas display, lights make the season bright. We have such a wonderful fascination with using lights to celebrate the season of Christmas. Could it be that we just like lights, or is there more going on here and it really shows itself at Christmas?

Sounds about right to me, but what is it about lights? Well, maybe the words of St. John in 1:3-5 help us with that. John tells us, "What came into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."

I like to think that our fascination with light at Christmas may be impacted by the reality that the light of Christ really does shine in the world. Whether we believe or not in the message of scripture, there is something about light shining in the darkness that captivates us. What really amazes me this Advent as I prepare to receive the coming of Christ, is that while we are looking at Christ as the light of all people, he is looking at us and calling us, "the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14). He is calling us, you and me, lights in the darkness.

He says this very early in Matthew and he is saying it to a people who while burdened with all of the demands and hardships of life, still are seekers after God. God is their light. It is then through faith that they are receiving the light of Jesus through their receiving his word. As they then believe that message, that God sees them, loves them and has come to them, they are empowered to live in the light of the Way of Christ and to shine that light to others. They shine it because they believe differently about themselves and therefore live differently, giving glory to God and love to a world in desperate need.

Yes, we are witnesses to the true light as we shine the light of Christ in our world. In us it shines to drive away darkness. In us it shines to light our path. In us it shines to testify to the one who is the source of light and life, Jesus Christ himself.

Those lights you see as you look at your Christmas Tree and the lights you admire as you drive through the neighborhood and observe the homes all lit up, proclaim the beauty of all those lives who have been ignited by the love of God through Christ our Lord. They stand for the countless lives who have been touched by the light and love of Christ.

This year as you look at the many lights, take a moment to focus on just one of those lights and imagine that it represents you. Imagine that it represents the light your life shines. Notice the area around it and see how it drives away darkness. Maybe you could light a candle and let it burn for the whole month of December. Take notice of it when you pray and give thanks that the light of Christ has come to you and dwells in you and in your home. Take a moment to realize the power your life and your faith has to bring hope, peace, joy and love to those around you.

As you look at the lights around you, be encouraged that the light of Christ seeks to illumine your paths and give light to all the ways you will go. Let this give you peace and purpose through this season and the new year.


