During our joint service a few weeks ago, I shared about a medical condition that I am facing. I want to take an opportunity here to share about my spiritual journey thus far. I hope this insight will be of some help to you as you face your own struggles, perhaps it will also be of assistance to you as you as you hold me up in prayer.

I shared that I asked the Lord for a word for me, and I felt directed to Psalm 27:1, "The Lord is my light and my salvation." I knew that the word for salvation is the same word for healing. I lived with that for several days, hoping to glean more insight into what the Lord might be speaking to me. Reflecting on "the Lord is my light," I realized that many people in times of intense healing prayer prayed for the healing light of the Holy Spirit. So, I wondered about the pieces I felt were beginning to fall into place, but I wanted more.

Another piece was that I felt the Lord say to me that indeed he would see me through this, and that my part would be to do battle. My first thought was that battle meant prayer and it certainly is, but I would receive another word and that came when the words of a song by Michael W. Smith came to mind. It was the song Surrounded and the line in the song that stood out was "This how I fight my battles," by which he meant praise.

The scripture he references at the beginning of the song is Isaiah 61:3 where Isaiah is listing the blessing of God's salvation and one of the things the Lord gives is "the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness."

Someone who is not acquainted with the ways of the Lord will not understand this because will assume that heaviness, worry, uncertainty must be lifted before one feels any desire to praise God and to give thanks. But one who experienced with praise knows that it is through praise of who the Lord is that the heaviness of our souls is lifted. It is through praise that we discover that the phrase "God is greater" is more than a slogan, it is reality, a reality that we are invited to live by. I think

that is why the Apostle Paul tells us in 1 Thessalonians 5:16–18 to "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

There is another line in the song that I find very powerful. It goes, "I thought that I was surrounded, but I'm surrounded by you." It is a reference to 2 Kings 6 where the King sends out an army to take Elisha into custody. When Elisha's servant awakens in the morning he sees an army surrounding them, but Elisha sees something else, and he prays for his servant's eyes to be opened. They are and he then is able to see a mighty host of heaven, surrounding those who had come against them.

What does all this mean? I do not yet know. As with any battle, physical or spiritual we have to let it all play out. One thing I do know is that my day is more and more being filled with praise. Some of it is music, and other times it is particular lines from songs that get stuck in my head. Other times it is just words of thanksgiving to God for his love, faithfulness, and goodness. It is amazing just how a spirit of praise really does cause a spirit of heaviness to evaporate. We really can do battle with praise.

It does more than just help with an attitude or state of mind. I tend to believe that it affects how our effectively our bodies operate. It can even cause our bodies to release chemicals that aid in healing. God has given us amazing bodies that can do amazing things. At times the stuff of our lives knocks us so off balance that only God can steady us. During those times if we really seek him and really listen we find that something has changed, our relationship with him has grown and we know more greatly the flow of grace and love from the throne of God.

Some of you reading this may know exactly what I am talking about, because you have been through times in which you have been tested and you have emerged changed, transformed, and you know joy where there was once pain and heaviness. God does not spare us the difficult things, instead he fashions them in a way that grace flows and he can be found if we are willing to reach out, take his hand, and walk with him. It's impossible not to be affected when God is this close to us.

I am finding my spiritual attention being fine tuned to pick up on the slightest thing. Each time it is a blessing. Well, I hope I didn't ramble too much here and that you can absorb some insight to aid you in your journey. Remember, great is God's faithfulness to us. The real key to knowing it is that above all else to seek the Lord, just seek him. Praise him and let yourself be caught up in it.


